How can I help the Emmett Public School Foundation?

The term “planned giving” describes the many ways in which individuals make charitable gifts beyond that which is given for a specific fund-raising event or annual cash donation. With careful planning one can often make a more substantial gift than first expected and can often realize substantial tax benefits in the process. Several ways in which planned giving can be accomplished include:

- Donation of capital income to the Foundation.
- Making the Foundation a beneficiary of an IRA or other retirement plan.
- Making a bequest to the Foundation in your will or revocable trust
- Donation of land or making the Foundation a beneficiary of land

While these are the most common ways in which individuals make planned gifts, other forms of giving exist. The Foundation can be creative and flexible in accommodating donors’ needs.

What will my contribution be used for?

As a contributor to the EPSF you will have the ultimate say as to what and where you wish your donation to be used. Some possible ideas are:

- Promote general education and vocational education programs.
- Provide leadership training, scholarships, and grants to students and teachers to further educational opportunities.
- Promote family education including parenting and family unity.
- Promote community and alternative educational opportunities for adults.
- Promote the use of technology.
- Improve educational facilities and equipment.
- Provide special needs for exceptional children including the gifted and talented students.
- Promote joint school-Community projects.
